"We like the raw woody look and rough wall textures but we also want it to be trendy like denim jeans". The client's sons Samir and Kunal.


Vaastuvit Associates is a design firm started by 3 Architect friends Sudiksha, Sonia and Milind after completing their architecture degrees in the year 2007.












Magic with colours and graphics. A journey from yellow, mustards and brown to the greens, blues, and soothing whites.

They experimented with colours, textures and finishes to achieve the desired outcome. Sonia put all the raw and green elements together finally.




